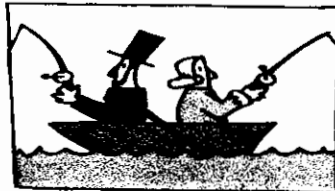

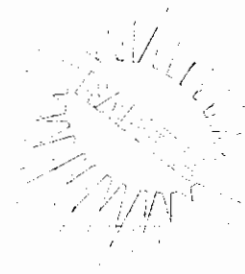
KIDS POINT OF VIEW:
